ARIDE PARTICIPANTS ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND THE DUI INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION COURSE FOLLOWING ARIDE ON JANUARY 14, 2026 COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) is a 16-hour course that introduces officers to drug impairment. The course is intended for police officers that have completed the 24-hour Standardized Field Sobriety Test (SFST) Course. This course satisfies the Illinois Department of Transportation Sustained Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) Grant requirement of having an SFST refresher every four years from the date of the officer's last completed certified training.

ARIDE was developed by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and prepares police officers to conduct various drug-impairment detection tests at roadside for use in drugged-driving investigations. ARIDE will offer additional information to law enforcement officers on detecting impairment caused by more than just alcohol. Officers will become more proficient with Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus, Walk and Turn, and One Leg Stand tests. Officers will also learn the lack of convergence test, estimating pupil size, modified Romberg balance test, finger to nose test, as well as pre-exit tests. The Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) role in the DUI investigation process is explained.

Participants will also receive a legal update including processing an arrested driver, warning to motorists, toxicology sampling protocols, laboratory reports, and search warrants. The Illinois Statutes and recent court decisions impacting DUI are covered.

Every officer in the course will receive access to the latest digital resources on the Dynamic Impairment LLC website including flow charts, sample reports for a variety of situations, cheat sheets, research studies, case law and more.

This course is taught by DRE Instructors under the control and approval of the Illinois DRE/SFST Program State Coordinator.
